4. Chairperson's Report

This time last year, we were still very much living with the restrictions imposed due to Covid, as we held our AGM just on the cusp of restrictions being lifted. Last year's report, was all about the ever-changing Covid guidance, getting our Return to Play plan agreed by DCMS so we could return to court in some form, and strategies to both support clubs and manage the resilience and viability of the National Governing Body during those times. This year, happily, the report tells a different story.

This season, we had 81 clubs, compared to 79 pre-Covid. To see an increase in the number of clubs is an amazing testament to all those that are involved in running clubs, and to the wider korfball community. I'd particularly like to congratulate Leeds Hurricanes who managed to set up clubs during a very difficult period. Their amazing achievement was recognised in them being awarded the 'Club of the Year' award this year as part of the EK Awards. Of these, we have this year 22 university clubs affiliated to our English



League, including one as a new EK member. We would like to congratulate Alf Timney for being awarded the EK student of the year award for his work at Warwick University.

Our priorities, as part of our Covid strategy were to support clubs in gaining funding, and we're delighted that the final figures for contributions to korfball clubs from the Sport England Return to Play fund are £111k - an absolutely huge investment in clubs for a sport of our size. We did lose some teams as an impact of the pandemic, though not to the extent that we had forecast. We had 220 teams compete in our leagues this season, compared with 239 in 2019/20.

We also supported the transition from Fixtures Lives to Playwaze this season. Thank you to Hannah, Sally and all the other people who spent time getting this set up, entering data and working through bugs and fixes. We are now in a position to use this fully next season.

In terms of competition, the main and significant achievements are that we ran full competitions at all levels this year - so thank you to everyone that enabled that to happen locally, regionally and nationally. Congratulations again to Anna Jeanes from Croydon Korfball club for winning the Frank Sieber Award for competitions youth korfball.

The national league was closely fought, but congratulations go to Trojans again for retaining their title, and also congratulations to Cambridge Tigers for their Terry Sage award for fair-play.

It was also a return to the international calendar, and we were pleased to be able to navigate the Covid restrictions and various challenges with getting the senior England Squad to the IKF EKC-A (European Korfball Championship- A competition) in October. Congratulations to them on coming 4th. Sadly the European club competitions were cancelled, but the U19s represented England at Easter in the U19 World Korfball Championship and the U17s recently competed in the U17 Korfball World Cup - well done to everyone who was in those squads and made the trip happen.

In terms of wider achievements, I want to acknowledge the work of all the volunteers in our national committees. This is where much of the work of the NGB is done, with support and coordination from Hannah as our staff member.

Thanks to Steph Watson and the wider coaching committee and Joe Skeet and Kev Moss for all their work on updating the L2 and making it available via a hybrid virtual and in-person format. We hope that this will hugely improve the accessibility of the qualification. Congratulations to the 41 new coaches that took qualifications last season.

Thanks to Jon Roberts and Clive Dobbin for all their work on getting the Performance Programme back up and running, and developing a new strategy which aims to bring many more players through the Performance Pathway and with clear long term goals. This will comprise of an Elite Training squad, Elite development squad and junior programme. More details will follow about the junior programme shortly.

In terms of the EK Awards congratulations to the following people
- Charlotte Banks (Manchester Hawks), Luke Almeida (University of Liverpool), Sam Alexander (Bristol Thunder) for receiving certificates of merit.

- Caitlin Adams as Volunteer of the Year for Highbury Korfball Club, Ed Holt from Manchester Warriors and the CSC for his many roles in korfball who was awarded the



Graham Crafter Award of Distinction, Nick Howarth from Sheffield City Korfball Club who was awarded the Marion Atkinson Award of honour for contributions over the last 30 years, and finally to Chris West, who was awarded the prestigious Jan Hanekroot Award for a life time of contributions at club, national and International levels.

Outside of the English context, a number of EK representatives were selected for roles on the international stage in the last year - including Steve Wright for jury roles, Steve Jones, Azzy Sieber and Chris West as referees, Dean Woods as press officer at the World Games.

There continues to be challenges of being largely based on a volunteer workforce and key gaps impact our ability to deliver.

Thank you to Hannah Stockley for her time in role as National Development Officer. The role is currently out for recruitment and has been reframed as Operations and Memberships Officer, to better fit the current work priorities. Longer term there is still a wish for a Development Officer role. The continuing lack of Sport England mechanism for engaging new partners is disappointing.

The current strategy ends in 2022. We have paused strategy development to make sure we have the right team around it in terms of commercialisation and other strands. There is the potential for wider changes to the sport with new aspirations and drive at IKF level, especially in relation to a smaller Olympic format

We don't always get it right - we are all (including the Board) volunteers, shouldering a lot of responsibility and work. Thank you to everyone who contributes.

EP: Update on Charity registration

England Korfball was successfully registered last year, as per the members mandate, as a Private Company Limited by guarantee. This took longer than expected due to complications arising from the use of the protected term 'England' in our name.

The subsequent Charity application was refused on the grounds of some areas of the sport delivery not meeting charitable objections.



EK Board agreed to pause the charity application, proceed the strategy development and then reapproach the charity application. Registration as a charity is likely to continue to be the long term aim.

6. Receive sub-committee reports & members briefings Competitions SC (Dan Tibbitt)

- Thank you to the Comps SC Volunteers for all their hard work over the last season (Sally More, Sam Wells, Graham Crafter & Ed Holt)
- Very challenging start to the season with a lot of unknowns as we come out of Covid.
 Considerable work put into contingency planning.
- Thanks to the clubs and areas for their support and constructive work with the Comps SC to ensure competition delivery.
- Was great to see the successful delivery of the 21-22 season, including Inter Areas (Youth & Senior and NYD).
- There is a need for additional focus on Youth competition, especially in the context of the Performance Programme. Comps SC does not currently have the resource to deliver this, and previous recruitment attempts have been unsuccessful and so would encourage anyone who is able to offer support in the is area to please come forwards.
- Challenges but also positive potential of Playwaze.
- The triennial comps review is upcoming.
- The IKF European Club competitions have been a challenge with no consultation or input mechanism received.

Referees SC (Chris West)

- Thank you to the Refs SC Graham Crafter, Lol More, Kat Conley & Steve jones
- A challenging but successful year with all appointments achieved, despite challenges of Covid.
- Nine referee courses were delivered, with 105 passes, thank you to all who supported their delivery.
- In addition to EK leagues BUCS, Inter areas and NYD were supported.
- Feedback on duo refereeing has been supportive. Should be a useful tool in addressing the current lack of female referees, with representation at refereeing not reflecting that of the general korfball playing population.
- The revamp of the theory test to an online one is still underway, with the aim to still start in 22-23.
- This should help improve the diversity and transparency of the refereeing pathway.

QN: Lisa Swain (Bec)- Will the Refs SC rethink the points system to better reward referees officiating games not connected to their club. CW: Is on the agenda for the next Refs SC meeting for consideration.

Grand Finals SC (David Synott)

- This year's event at the UEA was low risk in terms of cost and organisational resource needed to deliver. A return to the Copper Box or similar will be much higher risk in these terms. There is far greater possible risk but then also return. This will be something that the EK Board will have to weigh up over the coming months.

QN: Gary Brooks (Trojans) Can the event be enhanced with inclusion of university teams, schools etc... to engage additional groups. DS: Have been in discussion with BSKA, yes potentially.

QN: Lisa Swain (Bec) is the separate SF the right fit? DS: Will respond to feedback and look at logistics.

HR Lead (Stella Hegarty)

EP Intro- There are now 45 approx. members in the Subcommittees and board. We are looking at how best we can support these volunteers. As part of this focus we have recently appointed Stella Hegarty as EK HR Lead.

SH:

- Previously a korfball player and BKA International chair, currently chair of Trojans KC
- Day job is as an HR lead for a large multinational company

Initial focus:

- Helping with the recruitment process (including current disciplinary officer vacancy)
- How to develop and allow feedback from the volunteers and subcommittees
- Producing a grievance policy sperate to on court discipline
- Day to day HR function of the organisation and looking at what is needed

Hannah Stockley- Common Minimum Standards (see attached slides)

QN: Peter Allen- Will these additional requirements not jut be an extra burden and deterrent to new clubs and coaches? HS: For new clubs and workforce, this will just be the norm and should therefore not have the potential challenge of existing clubs and coaches of having to 'backfill' to meet requirements. EP: A lot of this is non- negotiable to ensure that we meet statutory and insurance requirements. These are being put in place to provide much needed additional protection and support to clubs and the volunteer workforce.



QN: Anna Jeanes- Will there be more details on accepted/recommended first aid courses? HS: Yes this will shared alongside template resources.

QN Jonny Steer (Nottingham/EMKA) Request for more detail in relation to the Performance Programme deficit budget. Is this normal and sustainable? EP: For a number of years the decision has been made to run a deficit budget to allow investment in the sport. There is little flex in the budgeting, but normally deliver less deficit than forecast. Can't remain doing so indefinitely, however has allowed this approach in recent years. The performance programme normally runs on a deficit budget of £8-10K due to high cost of programme, however this has been agreed at a higher level this year to support the new Performance Programme and to invest in the new squad system approach agreed by the Board.

QN: Richard Woodham (Tornadoes) what is general admin? SW: A number of things including Mail Chimp, EK Chair travel to IKF events, Storage facility for EK and Performance Programme.
